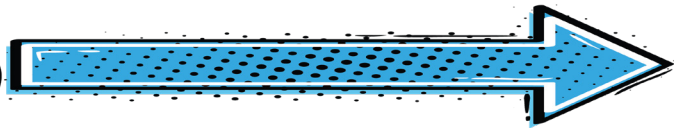

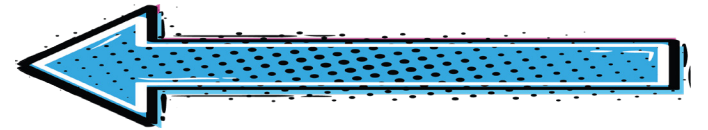

### **Accessing the Site**

- Navigate to our website [www.stclaircountylibrary.org](http://www.stclaircountylibrary.org)
- Click on the **Search Books & Media** tab.
- Once there, scroll down to the list of databases and look for the Morningstar logo.
- Click on the **Visit** link under the Morningstar description.
- You will then be prompted to enter your library card number which will create your access to the Morningstar Investment Center.
- There are a limited number of access licenses available at a time; so, if you cannot log in immediately, wait a short period of time and try again.

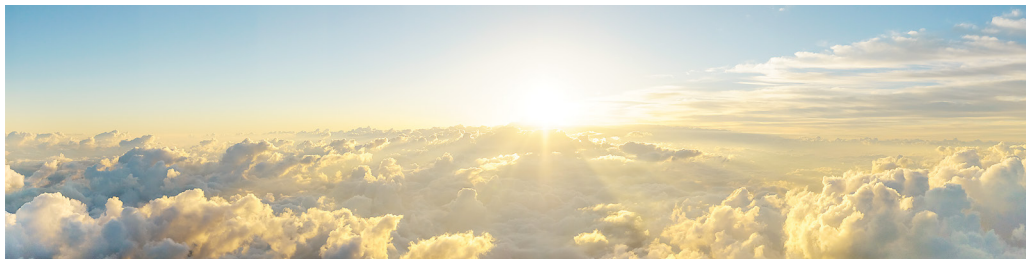
