The St. Clair County Library System presents
Summer Reading 2025: **Color Our World!**

This year, we're inviting readers of all ages to join us as we explore the vibrancy of art in all its forms. We will be using a new app this year, **Beanstack**, for logging minutes read. **Beanstack** can be found on the web or in your mobile app store. You will be asked to search for your library system, after which you will have the opportunity to register a new account, then choose the appropriate "challenge" (age group) for each of your readers. If you have any questions using this new app, contact your local branch for guidance. Paper logs will also be available.

The ticket-based raffle prizes are packed with bundles and other exciting items: a whale rocker, Squishmallows galore, board games, camping and crafting bundles, pickleball sets, plus tech like a minifridge, a projector, gaming headsets, and Fire Tablets — to mention a few! Grand Prizes largely focus on experiences this year, featuring gift cards for the Detroit Zoo, Discovery City, movie tickets, The Foundry in Port Huron, and more. You will automatically be entered into the Grand Prize drawings upon completing the summer reading challenge; you do not need to spend raffle tickets for the Grand Prizes.

Every 60 minutes earns a reading badge, which gives you one raffle ticket, or even more as you get more badges. Attending select library programs (listed in the **Beanstack** app) will also award a ticket each. For even more raffle tickets, you can tour the many beautiful libraries of our system using the Art Guide — like the treasure map from last year—featuring three activities at every branch for patrons to complete. The Art Guide can be picked up from any branch, and completing the whole guide will earn one 3D-printed or laser-cut object from a pre-selected list.

There are as many ways to interact with our Summer Reading Program as there are colors in the world, so grab a book, let your imagination run wild, and join us in making this summer a masterpiece!
