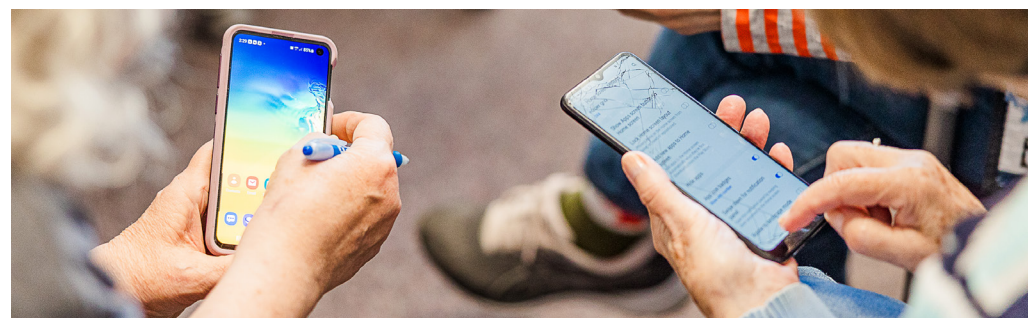

## CaptionCall is a Free Phone Service for People with Hearing Loss

CaptionCall is available to anyone who needs assistance hearing their phone calls. Telephone captioning transcribes all calls so you can read and understand every detail. You can talk to anyone, anywhere at any time night or day. You see the words displayed on the phone screen that the caller is speaking to you. Telephone captioning is a no-cost ADA service the government provides to people with hearing loss who have trouble communicating on the phone. Currently, the St. Clair and Port Huron branches have demo copies for you to visit. Feel free to stop in and get acquainted with this new and helpful technology.

### Why phone captioning is important?

- Trouble hearing on the phone is common, even with hearing aids
- Regular phones make it hard to distinguish speech tones
- Phone calls have no visual cues to support understanding
- People with hearing loss can lose the benefits of social interaction
- CaptionCall can help people stay connected with life

### How CaptionCall Works to Help You Understand Calls

- Captions add visual support to what you hear
- Agents help improve caption accuracy along with computer voice recognition
- CaptionCall has traditional and mobile phone captioning options

## Q&A

### Will the CaptionCall phone work with my hearing aids?

Yes. You can pair wireless hearing aids with both a landline CaptionCall phone and with your mobile phone to stream audio. The CaptionCall phone or CaptionCall Mobile App displays captions of what you hear.

### Can I still use the other phones in my home?

Yes. Every other phone will work as usual. The captioning service requires a landline CaptionCall phone or the CaptionCall Mobile App.

### How can the CaptionCall service be free?

Thanks to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), funds are set aside to help people with hearing loss effectively use the telephone. CaptionCall is an FCC-authorized captioned telephone service provider and is compensated for providing the captioning service by the Interstate Telecommunications Relay Service Fund, which is administered by the Federal Communications Commission.

### Who qualifies to get CaptionCall?

To be eligible to use CaptionCall, you must have hearing loss that necessitates the use of captioned telephone service. At the time of installation, you will be required to complete a self-certification and provide other mandatory registration information.

# Borrow a WiFi Hotspot

The library now has T-Mobile hotspots at every branch. The hotspots were partially financed with IMLS CARES Act funds through the Library of Michigan. There are 64 units that allow users to access Wi-Fi anywhere they go. The T9 units can connect up to five devices, and a fully charged battery will last for about seven hours of average use. They can be found in the library catalog, and they can be checked out for two weeks at a time by users who are 18 or over and are in good standing. The units were set up to help library users who don't have access to Wi-Fi. Please check with your nearest branch for further lending information and for availability.

- Hotspots check out for 14 days. They will be deactivated once overdue.
- Hotspots will be limited to one per address.
- These hotspots are reliant on cell phone towers serviced by the T-Mobile network. Most areas in St. Clair County are covered, but we cannot make any guarantees regarding service.
- Hotspots should remain in a temperature-controlled environment. Please do not leave the device in your car.



# Children's Library

We all know it's important for kids to learn to read, and to read well. Reading is one of the primary tools that helps kids succeed in life, as well as school, because a child that reads is a child that learns. Not just because they can read an assignment, but because when we read a story, we drop right into someone else's life. Reading develops empathy, as we begin to understand people from different backgrounds or challenges, different hopes or fears. Reading connects us to each other as we discover our own challenges, hopes and fears among the pages. Fiction is the moral laboratory where we are free to experiment without real world consequences.

Reading allows us to live someone else's life for a little while, so we're better at becoming the person we want to be. Stories let us try again. And again. And again. They help us find another way when the way we have seems blocked. Stories carry us into laughter, even when our real lives are filled with stressors.

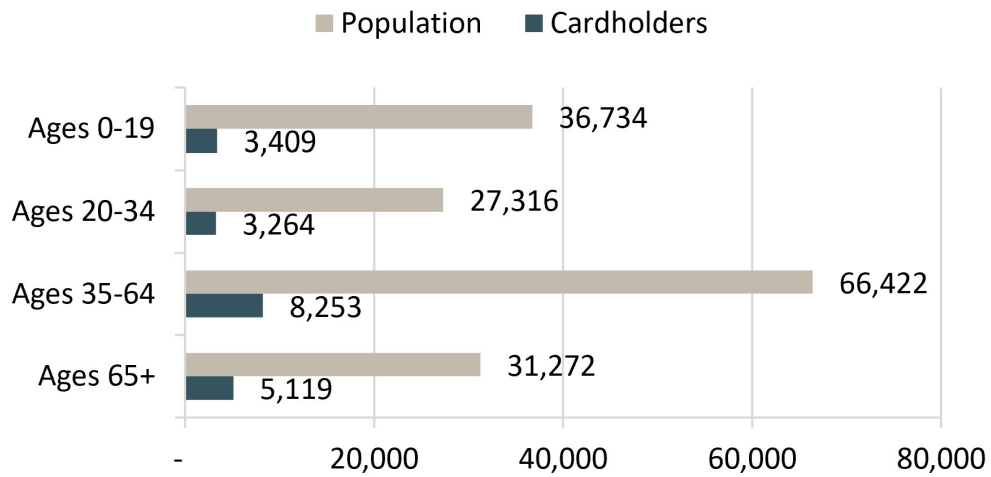
Stories may be the best thing our children can have to learn to thrive in this world.

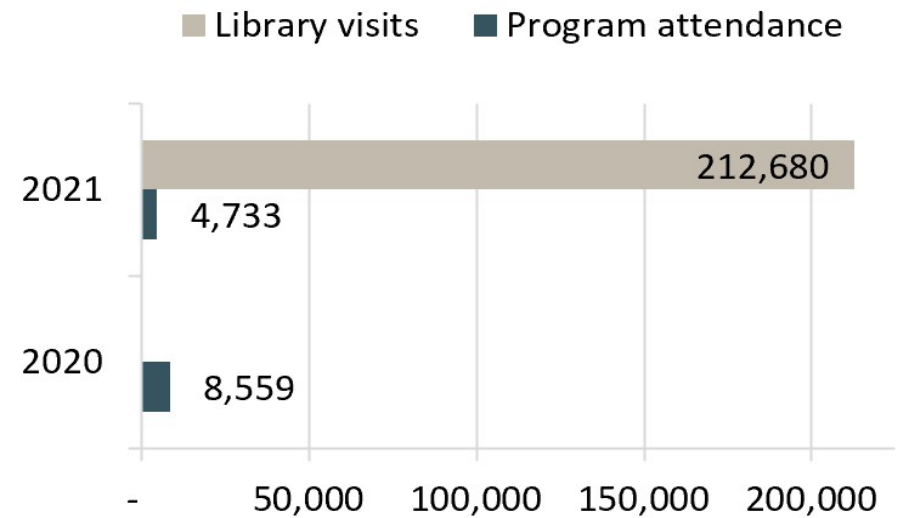


# SCCLS Library Statistics

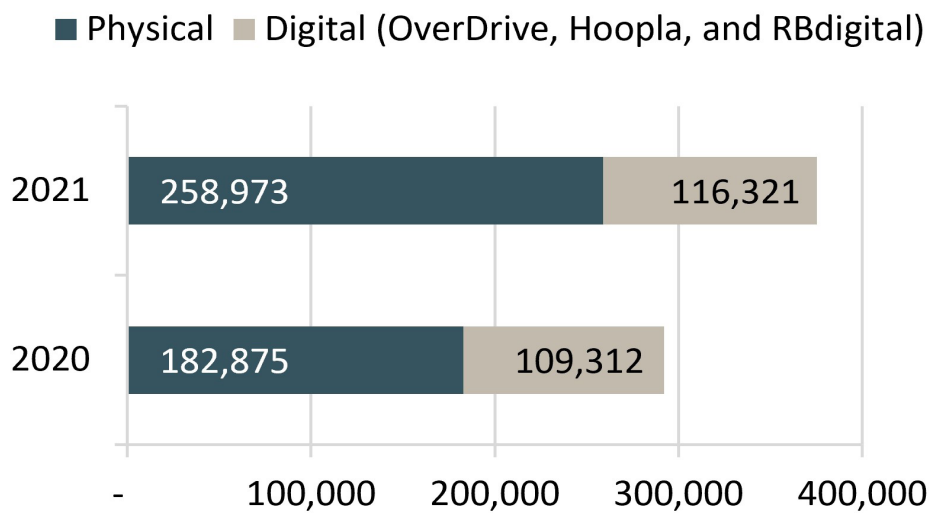
## County Population and Cardholder Demographics



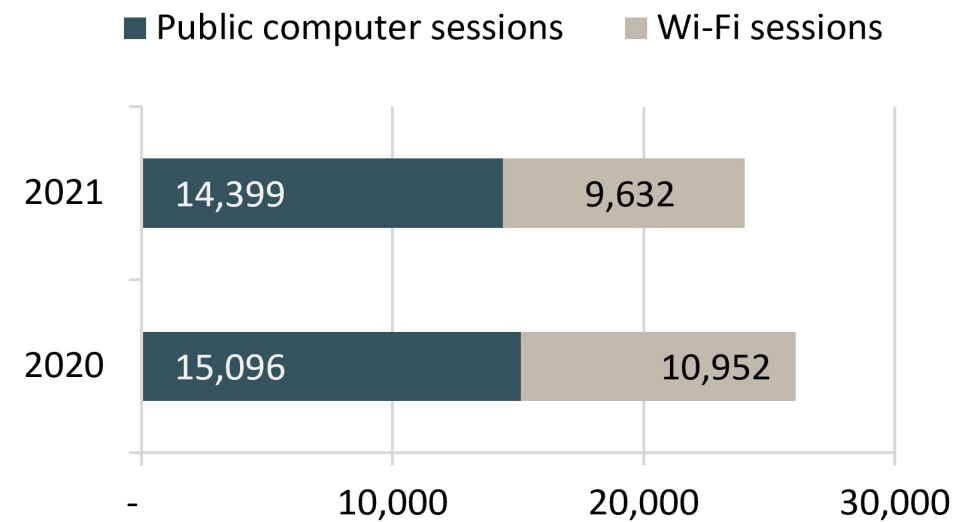

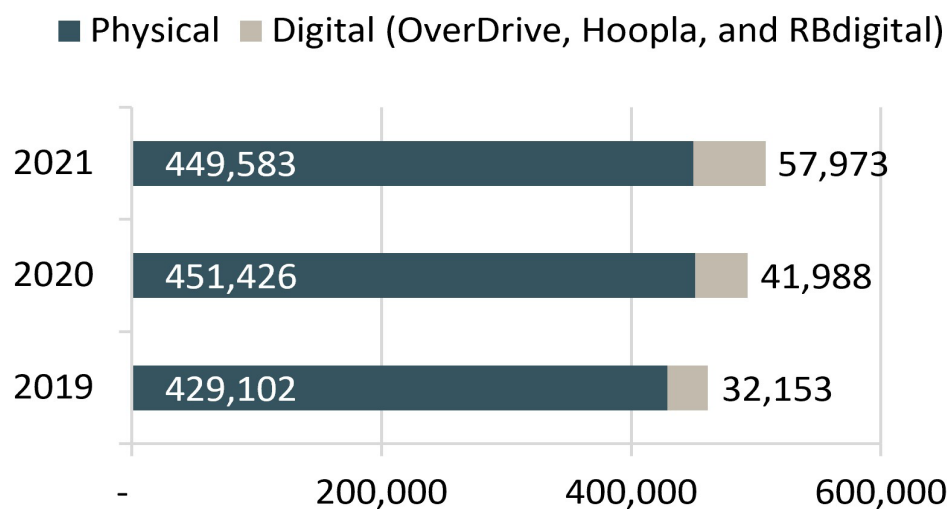

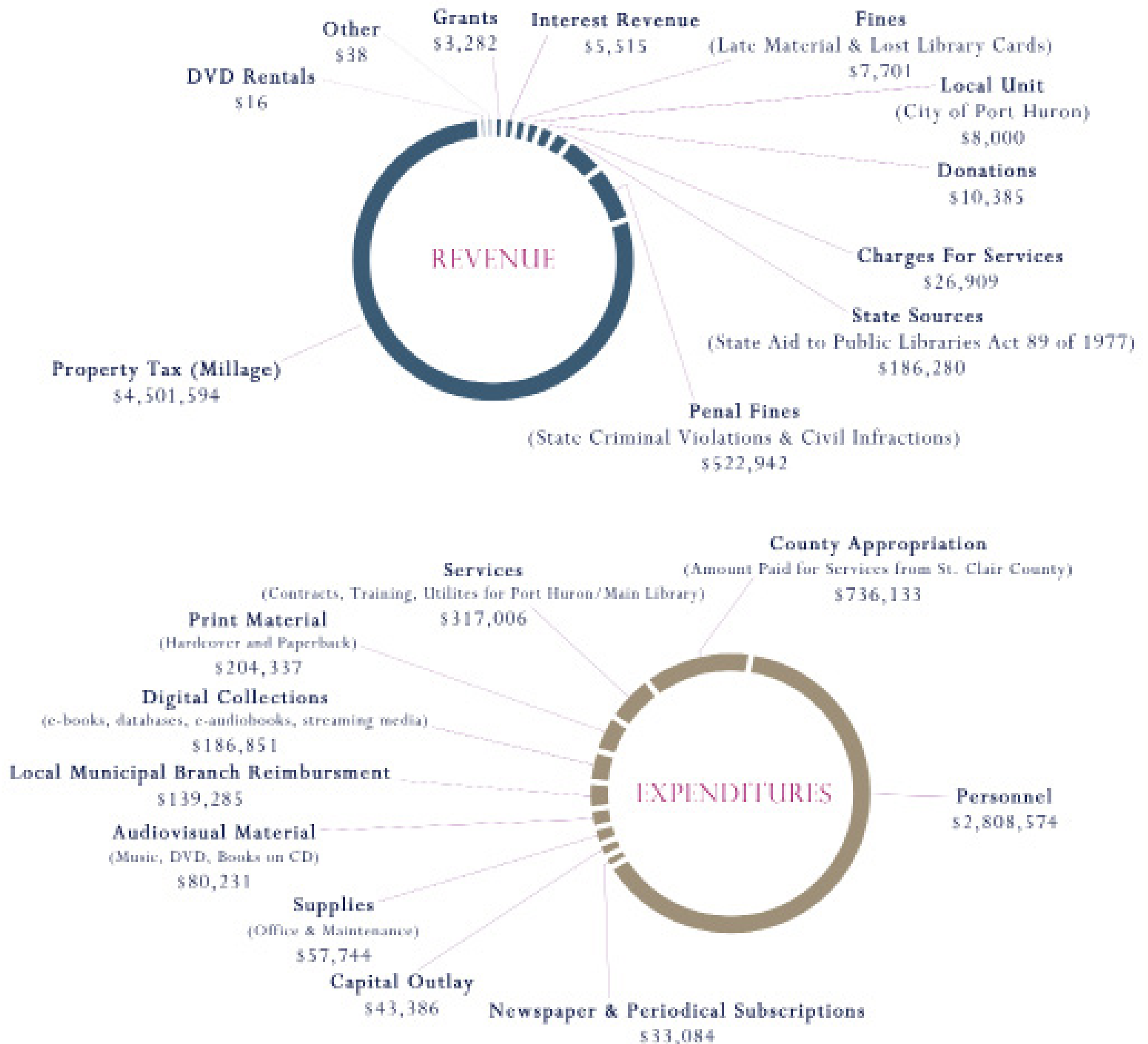
