Library staff will be happy to get you set up with an account or answer any questions you may have. Your library card works at all 11 branches in the county. Take your time to enjoy YOUR library. You don't have to rush in and out of the library- you can linger over the bookshelves and take your time finding everything you need.

Programs are here. If you're eager to attend programs, virtual programs are continuing and library branches have begun in-person programming. Subscribe to our monthly email calendar so you can stay on top of all the latest library happenings.

We have expanded the hours at each of the branch locations. I recommend checking the library's website or social media pages to see when you can plan your visit.

Curbside pickup is still available. All of the library branches are still offering curbside pickup services, which proved popular during the pandemic. Give your favorite branch a call if you need to use curbside pickup.

Michigan Room

The Michigan Room is a special collection of the St. Clair County Library System (SCCLS), located in the basement at the Main Library building in Port Huron. With a central focus on Michigan History, the collection contains books, yearbooks, microfilm, photographs, maps, newspapers, and pamphlet files available for genealogists and historians to use for research on the history of St. Clair County. It also holds several family histories compiled by genealogy buffs with ancestors in the county. The SCCLS subscribes to Ancestry Library Edition (available onsite only) which holds millions of records from across the globe. SCCLS is also an affiliate library with FamilySearch, which allows broader access to records on familysearch.org while inside any SCCLS branch.

Several items in the Michigan Room collection are also available digitally. Several high school yearbooks have been digitized for most high schools in St. Clair County. [YEARBOOKS / stclairlibrary \(stclaircountylibrary.org\)](http://stclairlibrary.org) The digitization of just one of the many unique items in our collection, *St. Clair County Poor Farm 1857-1893*, was supported in part by an award from the Michigan State Historical Records Advisory Board, through funding from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), National Archives and Records Administration. If you are interested in genealogy, you likely know that on April 1, 2022, the National Archives released the 1950 Census Records to the public. This event has been anticipated by the genealogy world for several years (Federal census records are usually sealed for 72 years in order to ensure privacy). The information contained in the records provides a picture of the nation as it existed on April 1, 1950. The 1950 Census will be available to the public on a dedicated website run by the National Archives and will include a name search function, with an option for crowdsourced transcription to assist with data accuracy. The data will also be available for download so companies like Ancestry and FamilySearch can host the census on their own sites.

The Michigan Room is a great space to view this census and many other resources that can help you with your research. Discover your family's story at the St. Clair County Library's Michigan Room. Please call ahead to make an appointment and ensure availability.

Large Print Available at all Branches of SCCLS

Those looking for larger type books or those who have compromised vision or physical limitations can now find those bestsellers, romances, westerns, fiction, Christian fiction and more at your local branch. Every branch now has a collection of large print books that cater to those who cannot read the smaller type that you see in traditional books. These large print books come in a variety of genres and contain large print; typically a size 14 font or larger. Most of these books are reprints of the original size, which was much smaller. Popular best-sellers of virtually every genre are usually reprinted in larger fonts. Authors include Mitch Albom, John Grisham, Janet Oke, James Patterson and Nora Roberts. The library is excited to bring these titles to every branch in the system.

Benefits of Large Print Books

You don't have to be a senior citizen to enjoy reading, but for many, poor eyesight can be limiting to their reading pleasure. Large print books provide readers with an opportunity to continue to read as you have done in the past. The following benefits are evident for those who use these books.

- Helps build and maintain vocabulary
- Provides mental stimulation
- Encourages reading comprehension
- Improves reading enjoyment

An article in Inc. stated that "Reading isn't just a way to cram facts into your brain. It's a way to rewire how your brain works in general. It strengthens your ability to imagine alternative paths, remember details, picture detailed scenes, and think through complex problems. In short, reading makes you not just more knowledgeable, but also functionally smarter. Which is why the only thing that everyone you admire can agree on is that you should read more."

While not every book is reprinted in large print format, many are.

For our Talking Book users: Do you subscribe to Talking Book Topics (TBT) in large print?

Supply-chain issues and worldwide paper shortages have impacted production of TBT in large print. But you can still get fast access to the latest issue of TBT online in HTML and PDF at www.loc.gov/nls/tbt. TBT in HTML contains direct links to BARD for downloading or adding books to wish lists, and TBT in PDF contains printable order forms for mailing. TBT is also available in audio on cartridge and on BARD and BARD Mobile. An abridged version of TBT is included in Braille Book Review, which is available as a BRF on www.loc.gov/nls/bbr and in hardcopy braille.

Borrow a WiFi Hotspot

The library now has T-Mobile hotspots at every branch. The hotspots were partially financed with IMLS CARES Act funds through the Library of Michigan. There are 64 units that allow users to access Wi-Fi anywhere they go. The T9 units can connect up to five devices, and a fully charged battery will last for about seven hours of average use. They can be found in the library catalog, and they can be checked out for two weeks at a time by users who are 18 or over and are in good standing. The units were set up to help library users who don't have access to Wi-Fi. Please check with your nearest branch for further lending information and for availability.

- Hotspots check out for 14 days. They will be deactivated once overdue.
- Hotspots will be limited to one per address.
- These hotspots are reliant on cell phone towers serviced by the T-Mobile network. Most areas in St. Clair County are covered, but we cannot make any guarantees regarding service.
- Hotspots should remain in a temperature-controlled environment. Please do not leave the device in your car.
